Snow Clearing

The snow season is upon us and the City of Enderby would like to remind residents not to park their vehicles on the road during or immediately after a snow event, as this interferes with snow plowing. When a snow plow is forced to navigate around a parked vehicle, it prevents the operator from removing all of the snow from the road. This narrows the travelled portion of the road and makes it more challenging as the snow accumulates.

Looking for some tips for snow clearing? Check out these from our website:

1. Be safe, wait for the wave! Be careful around snow clearing equipment – always make eye contact with the equipment operator and wait for them to wave you a signal that it is safe to go around.
2. Avoid doing the same job twice (Part 1)! Pile snow to the right of your driveway to prevent it from being pulled back across by a snowplow blade with the next pass.
3. Avoid doing the same job twice (Part 2)! Pile sidewalk snow to the back of the sidewalk rather than the front, so that it doesn't get pushed back onto the sidewalk.
4. Avoid doing the same job twice (Part 3)! Do not push your snow onto the road. Chances are, it will end up back on your sidewalk, so send that snow to its "forever home" the first time – behind the sidewalk.
5. Lighten your load, your back will thank you! Shovel snow early and often to prevent heavy lifting.
6. Pay it forward, snow angels! Help your neighbours and chances are they will return the favour and help you too. People who receive help are more likely to turn around and help others, so keep that good karma moving!

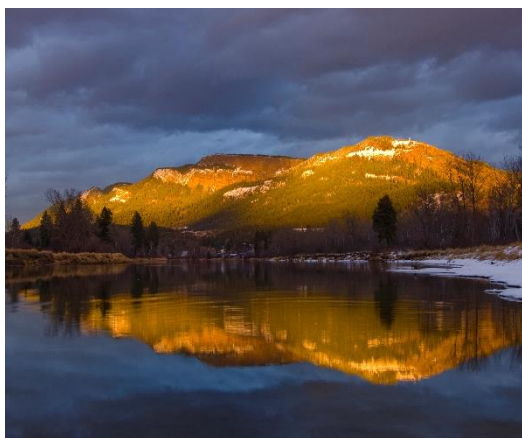
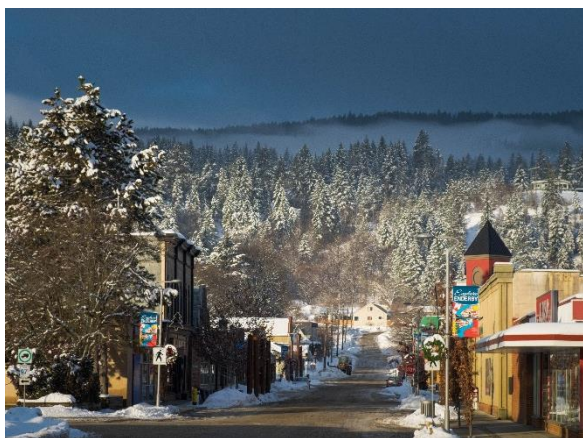
2023 Dog Tags

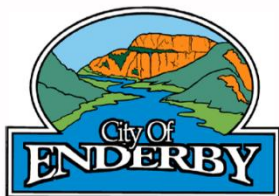
Don't Feed the Wildlife

Did you know that the City of Enderby is located in a wildlife interface area? Please ensure that your residential garbage does not become an unnatural food source for wildlife; this poses a danger to residents, your pets and wildlife.

Pursuant to the City's Wildlife Attractant Bylaw, please ensure that you:

- Store your garbage indoors or otherwise in durable, rigid receptacles that are fitted with covers that are inaccessible to wildlife; and
- Do not place your garbage at curbside earlier than 4:00 am on the day of collection.

Property Assessments

Have you looked at your 2023 property assessment? The assessed value of your property has likely increased as homes within the City have increased by an average of 13%. This does not mean that your property taxes will increase by that much! The City's annual budget is allocated to each property proportionate to assessed values – so, if your assessed value increased by the average amount, then your share will stay the same.

If you would like to file an appeal, follow the instructions noted on your Assessment Notice. The deadline to file an appeal of assessment is January 31st. BC Assessment is independent of the City of Enderby.
